

AAC Board of Directors – Meeting Highlights (unofficial)

Highlights of the AAC Board meeting held on Thursday, May 16, 2019.

- 1. Outback Agility & Dog Sports approved to host an All level AAC Judges Clinic on September 27-29, 2019 at Iroquois, ON.
- 2. Recognition extended to Brian Cooper for his time and effort in creating an AAC National website for the AAC's use.
- 3. AAC National Team and associated funding revised from being an independent associated entity to under the AAC umbrella once again.
- 4. Rule Changes or Clarifications
 - AAC Dog IDS must be presented at the time check-in at Regional events. If not presented, the dog must be measured to confirm jump height.
 - Clarification for AAC Rulebook Section 2.2.4: Although the AAC does not specify restrictions on dog training tools such as choke or limited-slip collars, head halters, harnesses (no-pull or other type) or extendible leashes, competitors are reminded that host clubs are free to impose on-site bans on these types of items only if stipulated in the premium. Pinch/prong and electronic collars (dummy or not), including citronella spray collars, are not permitted at AAC sanctioned events.
